Great Thanksgiving

One: The Lord be with you.

All: And also with you.

One: Lift up your hearts.

All: We lift them to the Lord.

One: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

All: It is right to give our thanks and praise.

One: It is truly right and our greatest joy to give you thanks and praise, eternal God.

Mighty God, you created all the beauty of our world: the majesty of the mountains, the rhythm of the oceans, the cool summer breezes, and the refreshing spring rains. You created all humanity and made us the center of your creation, bringing us joy in life. When we turned inward and forgot your beauty, you never turned from us, but called us back through your undying grace and love. You took on our flesh and came to live among us, not only loving us, but showing us how to love one another.

Therefore, with all people and all creation, we sing your praise:

All: Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might.

Heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest.

Gracious God, fill us with your holy Spirit and raise us up to be in holy communion with one another and with the risen and living Christ, that the bread we break and the cup we drink may be the communion of the body and blood of Christ. As this bread is Christ's body for us, make us Christ's body to the world.

Through the new life you have given us in the resurrection, give us the wisdom and courage to love as you have loved us. As Christ gave his life for us, help us to live our lives in humility and service. We praise you and thank you, Almighty God, amen.
